#### 2.1 We believe that a school uniform code will:

- Assist staff in identifying strangers in the school ground and therefore enable staff to ensure a greater level of safety for students.
- Assists in identifying students during excursions.
- Contribute to whole school unity and pride.
- Develops individual self esteem through the feeling of "belonging"
- Contributes to the development of a supportive community by reducing levels of competitive dressing.
- Supports social justice initiative by relieving parents and students of pressure to purchase high cost brand clothing.
- Develops a positive image of Lake Windemere B 7 to the wider community.

Parents and students on choosing to enrol at Lake Windemere B – 7 undertake to support the school in it's expectations that all students will wear the correct uniform, and maintain it and their appearance in a neat, clean and conventional manner at all times.
