Purpose

1. Purpose

1.1 In accordance with the Education Regulation 189A of the Administrative Instructions and Guidelines, Governing/School Councils are authorised to determine the school dress policy.

Action

2. Rationale

2.1 *We believe that a school uniform code will:*

- Assist staff in identifying strangers in the school ground and therefore enable staff to ensure a greater level of safety for students.
- Assists in identifying students during excursions.
- Contribute to whole school unity and pride.
- Develops individual self esteem through the feeling of “belonging”
- Contributes to the development of a supportive community by reducing levels of competitive dressing.
- Supports social justice initiative by relieving parents and students of pressure to purchase high cost brand clothing.
- Develops a positive image of Lake Windemere B - 7 to the wider community.

Parents and students on choosing to enrol at Lake Windemere B – 7 undertake to support the school in it’s expectations that all students will wear the correct uniform, and maintain it and their appearance in a neat, clean and conventional manner at all times.

Exemptions for reasons including; health, religious/cultural issues can be sought through the Leadership team.

Policy

Acceptable as Uniform:

- All Lake Windemere B-7 School clothing with logos
- Black pants, shorts, bike shorts/pants and leggings (not transparent)
- Green and white check dresses, skirts and skirts
- Black long sleeve tops can be worn under the Lake Windemere polo shirts

Finger-tip rule applies to determine the length of skirts, shorts and dresses

SCHOOL LOGO VISIBLE

Hats

- Black bucket hats as supplied on enrolment by Lake Windemere B-7

Footwear

- Rubber sole shoes or sandals
- ***Please note it is not necessary for footwear to be in school colours***

Jewellery

- Studs/Sleepers: 2 per earlobe
- Watch
- Medic alert bracelet/necklace

Not Acceptable as Uniform

- Jeans or other denim clothes
- Patterned clothes
- Clothes with brand logos
- Track pants with stripes
- Hoodies

- Any other hats, including caps

- Thongs/Clogs/Slip-Ons (with no backs)
- Platform
- High heeled shoes

- Hoop/drop earrings
- Bracelets
- Rings
- Necklaces

Body piercings must be covered and/or clear studs worn

- None
